

Basic Urogram Information

- The CT Urogram can take the place of an IVP as you will get a more conclusive view with higher detail and resolution.
- CT Urograms pick up lesions and tumors that would be more than likely missed on an IVP. Therefore, if you are looking for something other than a stone, a CT Urogram study is far more beneficial than an IVP.
- As part of the of Urogram, images are acquired in 3 dimensions and are reconstructed in increments of degrees from 0 to 180 showing the front back and sides of the ureters and bladder as it rotates, giving a clearer view and relationship of the ureters to the bladder and other surrounding areas.
- All patients having a CT Urogram (or Urography) will receive an injection of a contrast agent at the appointment.
- The CT Urogram exam is quite comprehensive and the appointment may take longer than other CT exams. Patients will be briefed on the scan length prior to their appointment by our scheduling representatives.

- When ordering an Abdomen & Pelvis with and w/out contrast, please indicate that it is for a Urogram.
- Urograms are a covered service by Medicare and most other commercial health insurers.
